'Autism, ABA and Schools: Weaving it all Together'

The purpose of this workshop is to better prepare all people involved with the child to assist within an inclusive environment using the principles of Applied Behavioural Analysis (ABA).

Ms. Wincz has travelled extensively throughout the United States, Canada, Europe and Asia providing consultation services to children with autism. She has set up behavioral programs for many families in British Columbia and is now working with FEAT of BC to improve effective, early autism treatment of young children with autism.

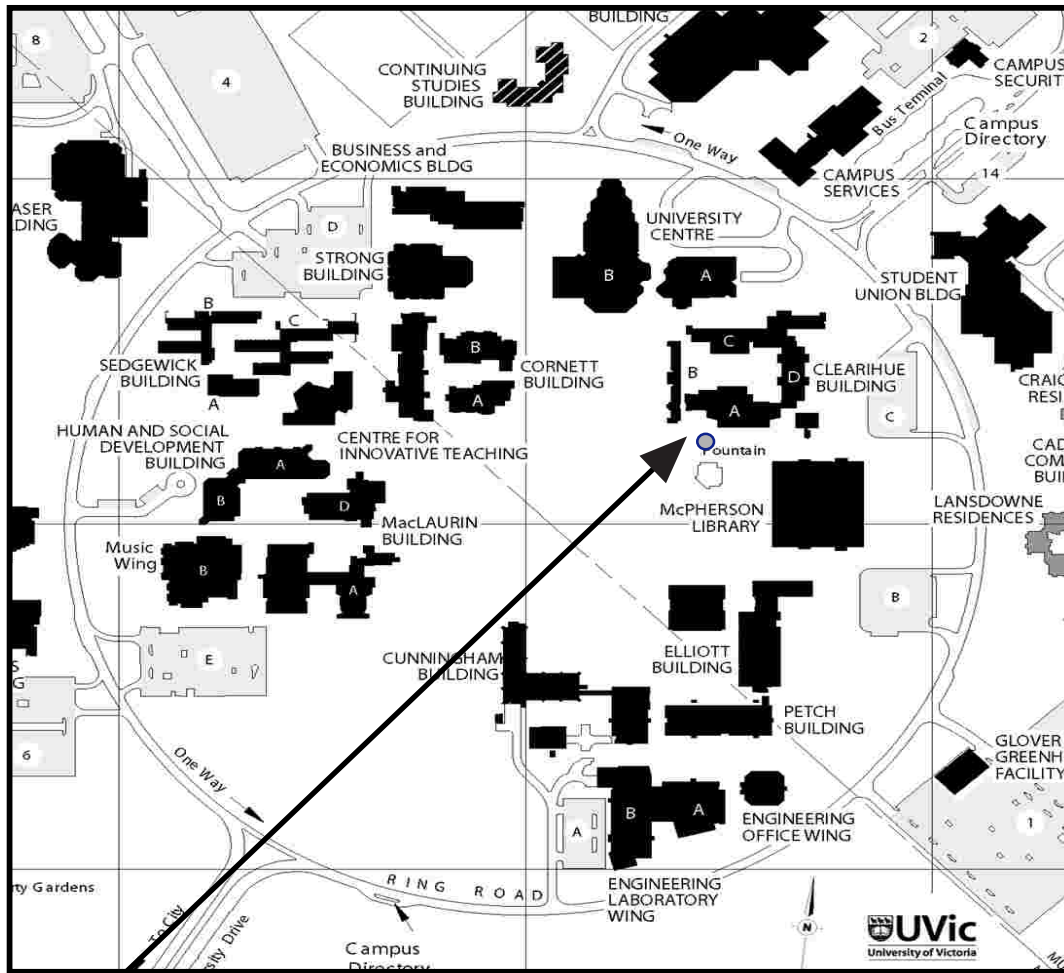

Location: Clearihue Bldg #A127

1) If coming from up-island, Southbound on Transcanada Hwy, turn left onto MacKenzie Avenue. Follow MacKenzie Avenue until you see U-Vic on your right. Turn right into UVic. That gets you onto University Drive (Ring Road).

2) If coming from Victoria, enter the Campus either from MacKenzie Avenue (right into UVic) or Cedar Hill Crossroad (left into UVic) which will get you onto University Drive (Ring Road).
